- Be able and willing to spend the time and money necessary to provide medical treatment and proper care.
- To never breed the animal
- Must return the animal to Ivy Animal Sanctuary should you no longer be able to care for the animal
- Must not be disqualified from keeping animals or have a deprivation order made under the Animal Welfare Act 2006 and / or have an unspent conviction for offences relating to animals.
